Comprehensive victim support for any member of the University community who has been a victim of interpersonal violence. Special Services advocates are on call 24-hours a day to provide options counseling, hospital and court accompaniment, and take formal police reports. Special Services can also provide support for students interested in filing criminal reports outside of Philadelphia. Special Services is a confidential unit and can provide support for students, staff and faculty who wish to remain anonymous.

### Reporting Violations of Penn's Sexual Misconduct Policy

As of July 1, 2019, all reports alleging violations of Penn's Sexual Misconduct Policy, including sexual violence, relationship violence, stalking, and sexual harassment by Penn faculty, staff, and students, are managed by the Office of the Associate Vice President for Equity and Title IX Officer (AVP). Complainants may include University students or others both within and outside the community alleging a violation of the Policy by an enrolled student or a faculty or staff member.
